given each year to a student who exemplifies our school's motto, Approve ye that which is excellent.

Orion's Broughton career was highlighted by four years of dedicated service and leadership in Junior ROTC. Beginning his first year as Flight Commander, he received promotions each year to positions of higher responsibility, finishing his senior year as Force Support Squadron Commander and member of the executive cadet staff. He also served this year as a Teacher's Assistant in a class of freshman JROTC students, where he enjoyed sharing his experience and being a role model for the younger students to grow into strong, service-oriented leaders themselves.

Orion also enjoyed three years as a section leader in Broughton's vocal music program. This experience was highlighted by the opportunity to travel with his fellow singers to Hawai'i to sing at the Pearl Harbor memorial in December of 2019.

In our community, Orion has shared his knowledge and talents in several ways that make our community and citizens stronger. He has worked as an academic tutor, volunteered at homeless shelters, and even learned how to build computers for a non-profit that provides computers for people in need.

In discussing his four-year experience at Broughton, Orion said, "Broughton has given me the best high school experience I could have asked for. I met my closest friends, learned the most valuable lessons, had the best interactions with teachers, and had the privilege of enjoying some of the most fun and unique extracurriculars offered at any school."

During our interview, the committee was impressed with the maturity and clarity of communication that Orion projected. The amount of growth he has gained during his four years at Broughton was remarkable and palpable.

During the summer, Orion was looking forward to continuing with tutoring and doing some camping in the mountains with his family. He has now matriculated at North Carolina State University where he is studying to be an engineer.

Ms. Madeleine Denechaud is the winner of the Mial Williamson Award, a one-time grant of \$4,000 to a graduating senior who embodies the spirit and character of Mial Williamson, a member of the class of 1949. During Mial's years at Broughton, he served the school with tremendous energy, enthusiasm and spirit. Among other activities, he was President of the Student Council and co-captain of the basketball team.

While Madeleine was a three-sport athlete at Broughton all four years, her passions and organizational skills led her to contribute to the school and her fellow students both on and off the sports arenas. Notably, Madeleine was Founder and President of the Pre-Med Club at the school, a club she

organized to fill a need to provide information to herself and her peers who are interested in pursuing medical careers. She was able to overcome the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic by arranging virtual interviews with doctors, nurses and physical trainers.

Her organizational skills were also on display as the head producer for the school's WCAP TV channel. Inspired by what she learned in her sophomore year's TV Programming and Broadcasting class, Madeleine plans to major in journalism at university while she pursues her pre-med requirements.

In athletics, Madeleine joined the cross-country team her freshman year along with the JV soccer and basketball teams. She quickly advanced to the varsity level in these sports. Due to an ankle injury her senior year, she was not able to finish her time as a player, but her determination and competitive spirit did not allow her to leave these sports altogether. She remained with her teams, cheering them on, and was even appointed as an assistant coach on her basketball team. Her work as a coach also extends outside the school grounds as she has led sports clinics in her own back yard and has been certified as a soccer coach for recreational teams and a YMCA middle school basketball coach.

On her three seasons of sports during her four years at Broughton, Madeleine said, "I have learned what it means to be a teammate---an encouraging, helpful, and inspiring leader--and I am grateful that I had the opportunity to represent Broughton."

Outside of school, Madeleine has developed a love for teaching and coaching. She has been a tutor for elementary, middle and high school students; and, during the pandemic, she saw a need to help students who were falling behind due to virtual learning. She created personal routines for each student to give them the structure they needed to learn and progress. Her initiative and drive were well recognized by the students and their families in helping them boost grades and gain confidence.

This past summer, Madeleine decided to get a head start on her university studies by completing her first course in Biology at UNC-Chapel Hill during summer school, where she is now pursuing a degree in Journalism and is planning to go on to medical school in the future.

CAROLINE OLSON, WAKE'S TEACHER OF THE YEAR



In May of this year, cheers rang throughout the Broughton's courtyard for the special-education teacher, Caroline Olson, as she was named the 2022-23 Wake County Teacher of the Year out of nearly 11,000 educators. Olson started her teaching career at Broughton in 2015. "Those of you who know Ms. Olson and have known her work since 2015 know that she is exceptional," said Broughton principal Elena Ashburn. "She sets high academic standards for her students. She believes in her students, and she does everything possible to make their wildest dreams come true." Betsy Graves, Broughton's dance director, said about her friend. Graves, who was Wake County's 2017-18 Teacher of the Year, decorated Olson's classroom with balloons and streamers to surprise her friend.

CAPITAL SPOTLIGHT: PAUL COBLE

Records indicate there are nearly 36,000 Needham Broughton alumni, but this should be no surprise since the school opened in 1929. Those graduates moved on to become business owners, doctors, homemakers, firemen, lawyers, plumbers, scientists, secretaries, soldiers, and teachers---the list goes on and on. You name it, and a Broughton graduate has probably done it. Many have distinguished themselves during their careers, but only one has served our community as both mayor of Raleigh and chairman of the Wake County Board of Commissioners, Paul Y. Coble ('72).

At Broughton, Paul was involved in many activities including student government, wrestling, theater, Hi-Y, and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He earned a degree in business administration from Wake Forest and was in the insurance field for much of his career. As a young businessman, Paul believed high county tax rates were harming employers and employees. The nephew of the late Sen. Jesse Helms, Paul was no stranger to public service. So, he started working with the Wake County Taxpayers Association and eventually became its vice president. He served three terms on the Raleigh City Council before being elected mayor in 1999. A few years later, he was elected to the Wake County Board of Commissioners where he served as both Vice Chairman and Chairman. As an elected official, Paul was known for focusing on

public safety, responsible growth, and tax issues.

Not content to be a local businessman or politician, Paul worked for the citizens of Wake County in a variety of ways. He has been a member of various boards and committees for organizations such as Wake Med, the Raleigh schools, the YMCA, and the 200 Club, a group dedicated to providing financial assistance to families of first responders who lost their lives in the line of

duty. He has chaired the CIAA Basketball Tournament Steering Committee, volunteered with the Salvation Army, and he has even coached local T-Ball.

In 2015 Paul was given the opportunity to work for all North Carolinians when he was hired to be the Legislative Services Officer for the NC General Assembly. He was tasked with managing the legislature's day-to-day operations. At his hiring, NC House Speaker Tim Moore and Senate President Pro Tempore Phil Berger called Paul a "proven leader" who "will bring a high level of professionalism to the General Assembly."

I've called this man various names (all good) through our decades of friendship – Mr. Mayor, Mr. Chairman, Mr. LSO, but usually just plain old "Paul". Whether or not you know his name, I think most people will call him a leader. Paul, thanks for all the years of service.

Your Alma Mater has two major fundraising organizations that support the school. This newsletter is produced by the NBHS Alumni Association, a 501 (C)(3) charitable organization.

The newsletter is a large function of the NBHS Alumni Association. In it, we publish updates on alumni, their reunions, history of the school and other items of interest to the alumni. However, our major mission is awarding scholarships to graduating seniors.

The Broughton Alumni Association Annual Scholarship awards one senior \$3000 per year for 4 years of college attendance as selected by the scholarship committee. They also give \$500 annually to support the Academic Boosters Club. These grants are funded by donations from all alumni and friends of the school through contributions, memorials, and excess of dues over expenses for the year.

The Broughton Alumni Association, also through the scholarship committee, oversees the Mial Williamson Scholarship Fund which awards a single payment of one \$4000 award to a graduating senior which is used towards college tuition and expenses. This scholarship was started and funded by the NBHS Class of '49 to honor their classmate.

To accomplish the above missions, the Broughton Alumni Association maintains a confidential data base of all alumni and asks that each person contribute \$25 per year in dues. Our executive director maintains this data base, keeps yearbooks from each class, and administers the tax and legal requirements organization. The Board of Directors has approved the creation and sale of an alumni directory every five years for those who wish to share their information. The Broughton Capital Foundation is also a 501 (C)(3) charitable organization. The Foundation supports current funding needs of the school not met by the county budget. Their stated purpose is to enrich and enhance the lives of Faculty and students by funding the following:

- Technology
- Online assessment programs
- Workshops
- Art resources
- Professional development for teachers
- Campus beautification
- Athletic facility enhancements and more

Both organizations support the legacy and experience of an education at Broughton High School, and we are fortunate to have volunteers who believe in the school.
